And we can see him quietly sitting at the Civic Association meetings.

Tony left his wife, Isabel; his mother, Rose; seven brothers and sisters; two children, Jack Jenkins and Betty Buckwalter; seven grandchildren and one great-grandchild.

And he left more than that. He left a tremendous void in the lives of all who knew him.

Arden, collectively and individually, wishes Godspeed to a truly good friend.

## ARDEN CIVIC ASSOCIATION MINUTES

February 19, 1968

The regular monthly meeting of the Civic Association was called to order at 8:15 p. m. with 19 members present.

Since the last meeting was held in November, no minutes were presented. The Treasurer's report was accepted as read.

Mr. Wilber, President, announced that Mr. Shvanda had asked to be relieved of his duties as Chairman of the Recreation Committee, although he had indicated a willingness to continue as a committee member.

Mr. Sudwarth presented an estimate for replacing all doors on the building with metal doors. After discussion it was agreed by those present that we should replace the one double door that must be replaced because of damage, and that metal doors with crash bars be obtained for this purpose.

Mr. Wilber proposed that a portion of the money in the Treasury be set aside and earmarked for future use on the building. In the past, money available has always been spent with the result that there has been no accumulation of funds toward the building. Following discussion it was voted that the amount of \$1,000 be so set aside.

Mr. Wilber announced that Mr. Niles had agreed to serve as Chairman of the Annual Clean-up Committee again this year. A Saturday late in April or early in May will be designated for this purpose as soon as arrangements have been made with the County for the pick-up.

Mrs. Martin volunteered to represent Arden in the convention to choose names as possible members of the school board to be presented to the Governor.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:45 p. m.

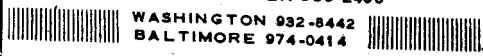
