CIVIC ASSOCIATION MINUTES

March 25, 1968

The regular monthly meeting of the Civic Association was called to order at 8:20 p. m. with 13 members present. The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved, as was the treasurer's report.

Mr. Wilber read a letter from Mr. Melvin Bender inviting us to join a group attempting to stimulate interest in the proposed new (state) constitution. A meeting will be held April 24 at 8 p. m. at the Severna Park High School. Anyone interested is invited to attend.

He announced that Mrs. McCoy, County Planner, had met with the Severn River Association and led a discussion concerning the development plan. The SRA is directing a letter to the County Council in support of Mrs. McCoy's plan for water usage and in support of the plan.

Mr. Wilber is going to try to find someone who is interested in serving as Chairman of the Recreation Committee.

Mr. Niles reported the County will come in and replace the two signs which were vandalized. Also the horses that had been brought into the community are gone. The backstop for the ballfield had been erected and he needs some information about insurance on the grounds.

The broken door is to be replaced by Russell Smith at a cost of \$198.

Mr. Niles announced that the annual clean-up day is to be April 20, a Saturday. He still needs two representatives from each section to serve as coordinators for the respective sections.

Mr. Rozmarynowski, for the Beach Committee, requested information as to the status of last year's recommendation for lights on the beaches.

Mrs. Zelaya made a report on the proceeds of last year's Bingo games as turned in by Mr. Sudwarth. Mr. Sudwarth requested that \$55.00 of the money turned in be placed in the

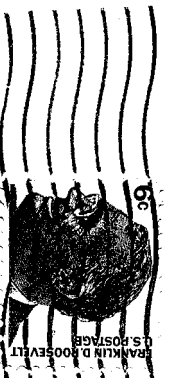
