Should a member wish to make an additional nomination, he can do so at either the May or the June meetings. However, he should first make certain his candidate agrees to serve in office if elected.

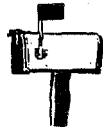

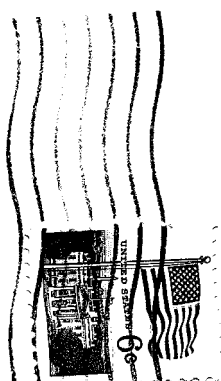
