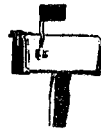

ARDEN CIVIC ASSOCIATION MINUTES MAY 1968

The meeting was called to order at 8:15 by the President. The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved, as was the Treasurer's report. Seventeen members and guests were present.

Mr. Wilber noted receipt of several communications, among them one from the Bureau of Community and Industrial Affairs, Anne Arundel County, spelling out the new regulations regarding the burning in the open, to become effective on 28 May.

Mr. Wilber also read a letter he had dispatched to the Commission on Mental Hygiene regarding future use of the Crownsville State Hospital farm land. He requested that two parcels adjacent to Arden be set aside for recreation purposes before any disposition is made of the land.

Another letter had been written to Mr. Niles expressing the thanks and appreciation of the community for his splendid work in planning and directing the annual clean-up drive.

Mrs. Wilber reported the Landscaping Committee had purchased some fencing which will be installed temporarily at the side of the building where shrubs are to be planted. When the shrubs have attained a reasonable growth, the fencing will be moved around to the back of the building for the same purpose.

The Membership Committee reported we have a total of 60 \$5 members, 73 \$3 members, with a total of 193 voting members in the Association for this year. Another membership drive will start next month, and it is hoped we can exceed this year's membership total.

Mrs. Meredith requested a date be established for the dedication of Teufel Park. June 23 was decided upon. Mrs Meredith will be responsible for planning the ceremony and assuring appropriate publicity in advance of the event.
