The Civic Association is non-profit, non-

Other sources of ACA revenue are the Ar-

Current ACA projects include installing
playground equipment at the four beaches
and park areas, preparing a softball field,
landscaping the community building, adding
parking and storage space, coordinating with
Beach Shores, Inc. on the installing of sea
nettle nets and swim team turn boards, and
with the Severn River Association on water
pollution and river zoning.

The ACA sponsors the Teen Club and the

summer Red Cross swimming instruction.
Past Association efforts have resulted in
the erection of snow fences protecting Omar
Dr., street signs, Arden signs and bulletin
boards, new street lights, and the conduct
of the annual May clean-up campaign.
The ACA is also campaigning for communi-
ty workers and cash donations for future
recreation facilities, building additions for
storage space and general community im-
provement.

CIVIC ASSOCIATION MINUTES

June 17, 1968

The meeting of the Civic Association was called to order at 8 p. m., by the President with 32 members and guests present. The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved, as was the Treasurer's Report.

Mr. Wilber reported that Dr. Tuerk, Commissioner on Mental Hygiene, had responded to our inquiry about the farm property and said they would keep us informed when a decision is made.

Mr. Wilber also announced that there is a Police-Community Council which meets at the Millersville Headquarters once a month, and that it would be a good idea for our community to send one or more representatives to these meetings.

It was announced that a key to the building has been left at Mead's store to be used by both the telephone man and the oil man.

Mr. Wilber also announced that the price originally quoted for replacement of the doors in the building has gone up by almost 30 per cent. Mrs. Martin made a motion, seconded by Mrs. Meredith, that we approve the purchase of the doors at the increased cost. The motion was carried unanimously, and Mr. Smith was instructed to proceed with the installation.

It was also announced that dedication of the memorial at Teufel Park will be held at 2:00 p. m. on Sunday, '23 June.

At this point Mr. Atas was introduced and he spent some time in discussion of his future plans for Arden and the beaches.

Mr. Wilber announced that Sgt. Barber had made arrangements for some films on safety which he would show on Beach 1 if there is sufficient interest.

At this point, the election of new officers was held, with

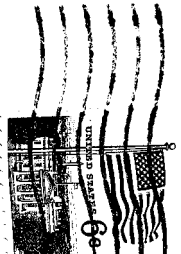
