MARINE RULES

The Marine Police has called attention to the need for careful boat operation to avoid capsizings which accounted for 23 of 44 boat mishap drownings recorded during 1967.

To prevent capsizings, these precautions should be observed:

1. Do not overload the boat.
2. Keep weights low in the boat.
3. Do not stand up or move about in small boats.
4. Do not go out in bad weather.
5. Check weather forecasts before leaving.
6. If bad weather makes up while out, head the boat into the sea and reduce speed. Put on life jackets approved by the Coast Guard.
7. If the boat capsizes, stay with it to await help rather than striking out for shore.

WATCH THOSE FIRES!

Open-air Burning

- (1) Open-air burning is prohibited except under the following conditions:
 - (a) There must be a fire break (natural or constructed) at least ten (10) feet wide completely around the material to be burned, free of inflammable material, and
 - (b) There must be present adequate personnel and equipment to prevent the fire from escaping, and
 - (c) There must be at least one responsible person at the location until the last spark is out.
- (2) During the months of March, April and May and from September 15 to December 15, inclusive, there shall be no open-air burning except between 4:00 P.M. and 12 midnight, E.S.T., or except when the ground is covered with snow, and then only in compliance with the conditions specified in subparagraph (1).

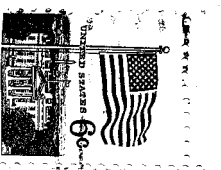
