OUR FIRE DEPARTMENT DEDICATES NEW HALL SUNDAY, OCTOBER 6

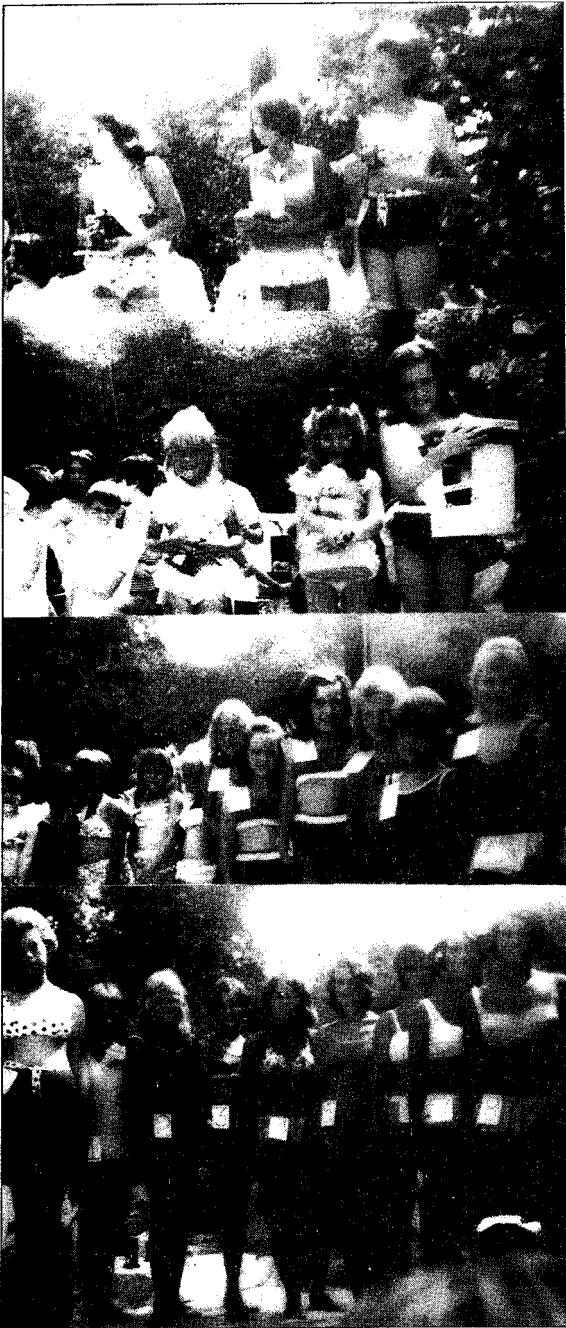
Dedication of the new Herald Harbor Fire Department building is Sunday, October 6 at 3 p. m.

The new facility, with expanded accommodations for 10 firefighting units, replaces the building across the street which has been in service since 1927.

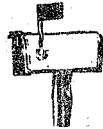

CONTROL AND PROHIBITION OF OPEN FIRES

No person shall cause, suffer, allow or permit an open fire except under the following conditions:

- A. When such fire is set or permission for such fire is given in the performance of the official duty of a public officer, and in the opinion of the public officer, is necessary:
 - (1) For the purpose of the elimination of a fire hazard which cannot be abated by any other means.
 - (2) For instruction in methods of fighting fires.
 - (3) For the purpose of removing any hazardous material.
- B. When such fire is set in the course of an essential agricultural operation in the growing of crops, raising of fowl or animals, or in the course of accepted forestry practices, provided no nuisance is created.
- C. When fires are set for demolition of buildings and clearing of land for roads or other construction activities under conditions stipulated in writing by a Control Officer.
- D. When salamanders or other devices are used for heating by construction or other workers, provided no nuisance is created.
- E. When burning material originating on the premises by individuals residing on the premises, excluding commercial establishments, where no provision is made for public collection of the material being burned, and no nuisance is created.
- F. When fires are used for outdoor cooking or other recreational purposes, and no nuisance is created.
