Teenagers and parents look for the "teen thing" happenings.

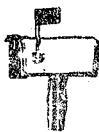
The first is a "Hippy Happening" November 8. All teens are invited. Come as hippies. The "teen things" are adult sponsored happenings for the teens of Arden.

CIVIC ASSOCIATION MINUTES

September 1968

The meeting was called to order at 8:00 p. m. by President Al Doda with 14 members and one guest present. The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved. In the absence of the Treasurer, Mr. Wilber reported.

Before going into business discussions, Mr. Doda introduced Mr. Edward C. Webby of the Bureau of Community Affairs for the County. His job is to serve as liaison between the County and the various civic organizations.

During this portion of the meeting, Mr. Webby discussed with members present the items that the community would like to obtain from the county, among these were street lights, road paving and upkeep, drainage problems, brush along the roads, street signs and so on.

Mr. Wilber suggested that they would like to sponsor a teen night once a month if enough interested teen parents can be located to work with them, and will go ahead with the first such event prior to the next meeting.

Mr. Wilber moved that we place \$500 in the special building fund. The motion was seconded by Mr. Davis and carried.

The meeting adjourned at 9:45 p. m.

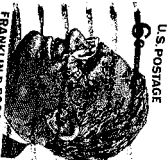


