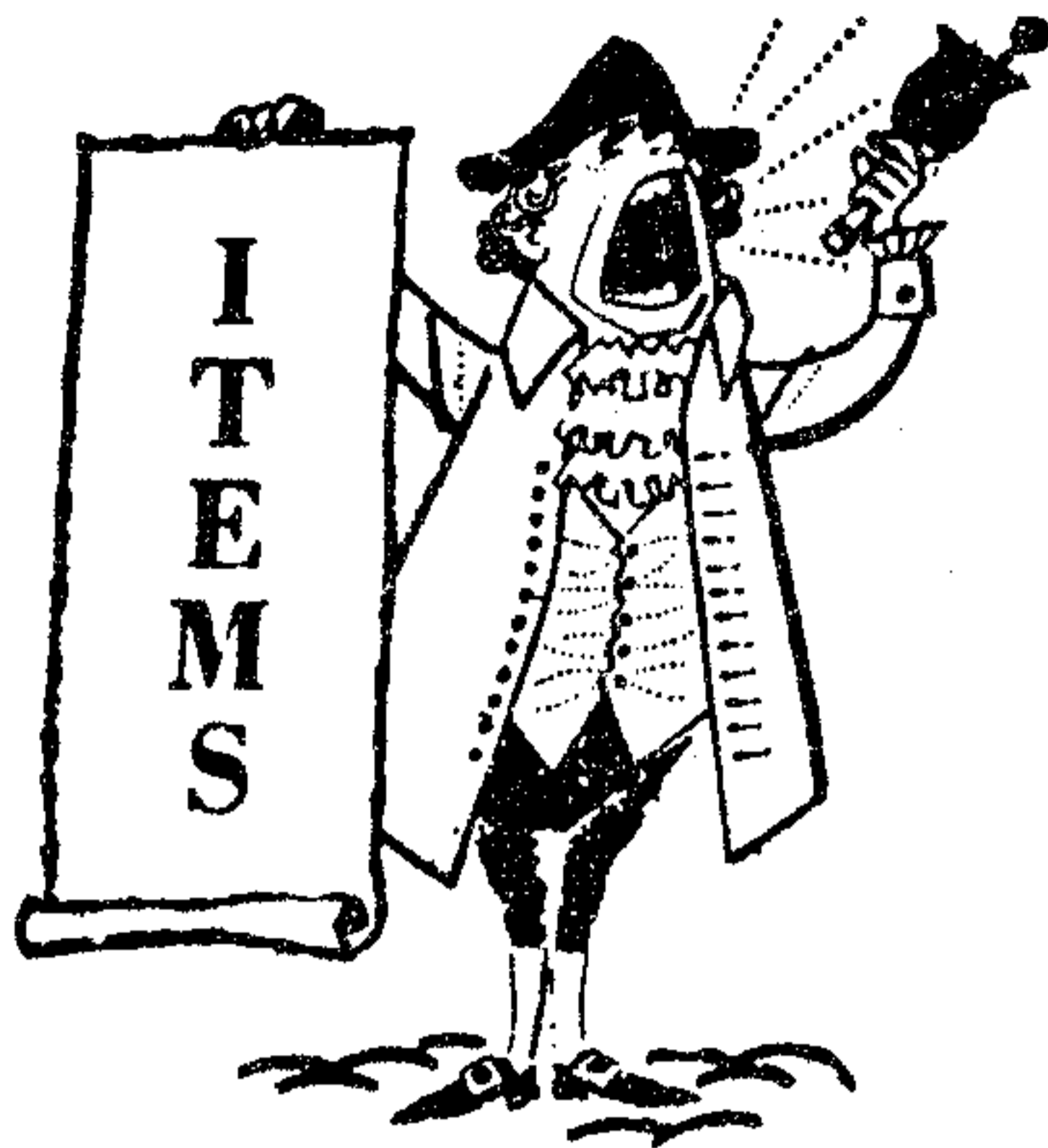

CIVIC ASSOCIATION MINUTES

March 21, 1969

The meeting was called to order at 8:05 p. m. with 25 members and guests present. The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved, as was the Treasurer's report.

Mr. Sudwarth reported he had met with County representatives to discuss the extension of the drain adjacent to the building so that we can provide additional parking space. They had suggested three lengths of pipe, plus a catch basin. Another inspection is to be made and another report will be given at the next meeting.

Mrs. Wilber, reporting for the Landscaping Committee, said that three of the fence posts alongside the building have been broken off at ground level and should be replaced with metal posts. It was voted that three metal posts be purchased and installed with an expenditure of up to \$3.49 per post.

The problem of the trash cans at the building blowing over or being knocked over and strewing trash around the area was discussed. Mr. Stanley agreed to serve as chairman of a committee to solve the problem.

Mr. Davis agreed to contact Mr. Atas about several problems which need attention in various parts of the community.

Mr. Rozmarynowski asked whether any progress had been made regarding installation of a light at Beach 5 and recalled that Mr. Atas had indicated he could secure this installation for us. A motion was made and carried that Section 5 go ahead with negotiations with Mr. Atas on this matter.

Mr. Sudwarth reported a letter had been sent to the County requesting either 26 April or 3 May for the Annual Clean-up Day. Mr. Wilber will be chairman for this project. We expect to be able to use a portion of the farm for placing the trash to be picked up by the County. Mr. Russell suggested personal contact for getting volunteers to help.

Mr. Trask requested information about the possibility of a Little League team for the Community. He agreed to serve as chairman of a committee to investigate this idea. He will be assisted by Mr. Dean as co-chairman, and Mr. Russell, Mr. Sparhawk and Mrs. Couch

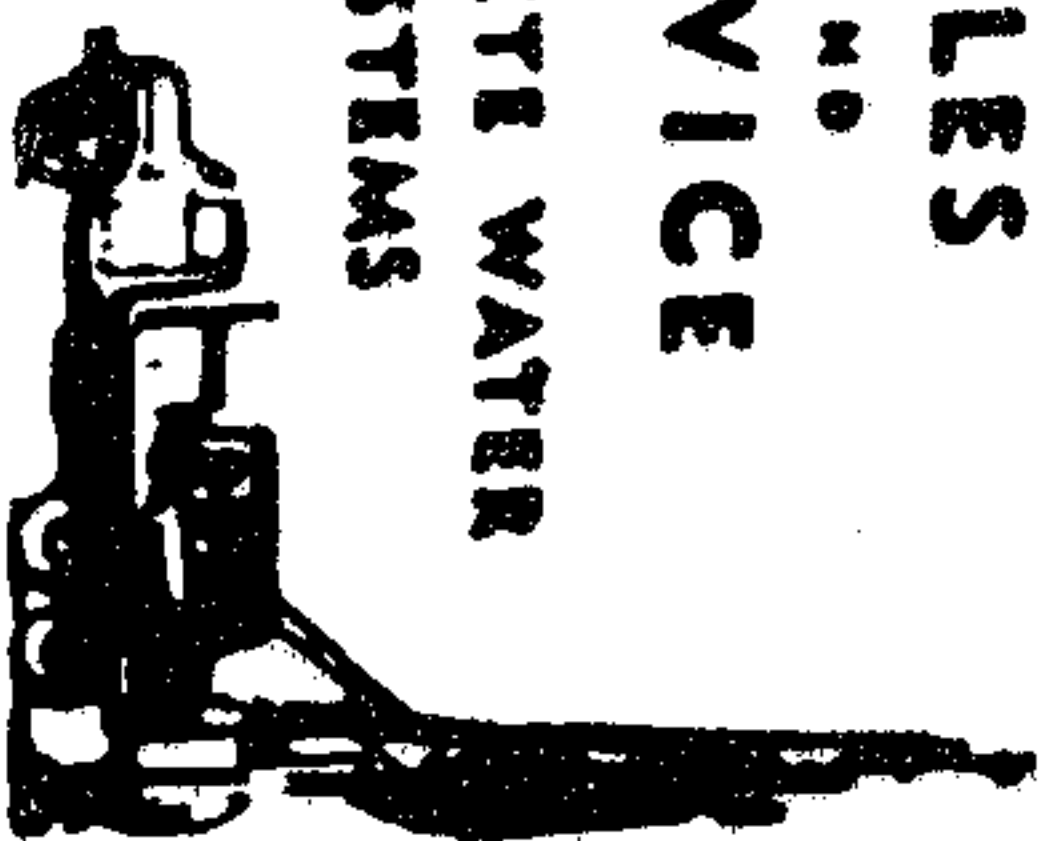

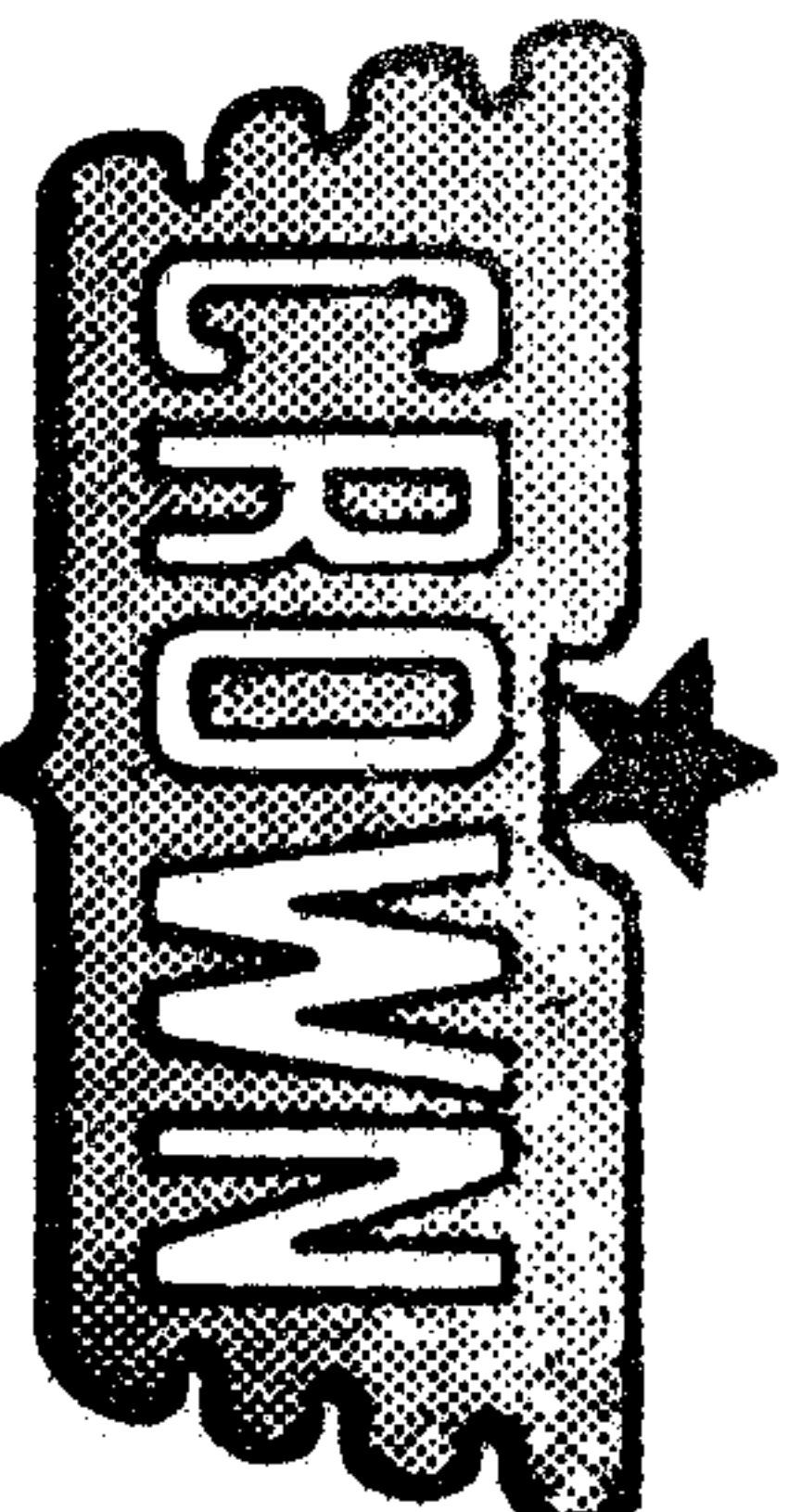
