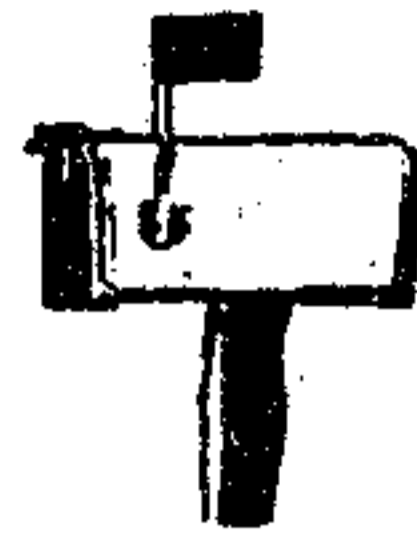

## CIVIC ASSOCIATION MINUTES

April 21, 1969

The regular monthly meeting of the Civic Association was called to order at 8:10 p. m. with 37 members and guests present. The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved as was the Treasurer's report.

Mr. Ralph Strootman, Chairman of the Public Relations Committee and editor of the Newsbuoy, announced that the Treasurer's report could be amended to show an increase of \$93.50 which was being turned over to the Association. This amount represented profits from the sale of the 1968 directories. At the same time it was pointed out that the 1969 directories are now available and will be sold at \$1 each.

Mr. Sudwarth announced that May 3 has been designated as Arden Clean-Up Day. The County will pick up the collected items on May 5.

Mr. Sudwarth also announced that work has begun on clearing and filling the land adjacent to the present parking area. He also announced that three new roads have been blacktopped or resurfaced in Section 4 and some additional fill is going into Holly Drive in Section 3. Mr. Sudwarth also requested a vote of thanks from Arden residents to Mr. Dwight Steele and his crew of helpers who managed to clear the sunken boats which had been blocking the boat ramp at Section 4 dock. Also, that the beach committee is scheduled to meet with Mr. Atas on Thursday evening.

Mr. Trask announced that 25 boys had attended the meeting on Saturday to discuss possibilities of getting a team started in Arden. They have contacted representatives of the hospital about getting an area 400 x 500 on the farm adjacent to Miner Road and Plum Drive. That committee will need all the help it can get. The question of insurance for the team will be discussed and a report made at the next meeting.

At the request of Mr. Trask, a motion was made and carried that \$200 be made available by the Association to the Committee for the purpose of buying equipment for the team.

Mr. Walt Sulewski spoke about a meeting to be held on April 28 on the subject of Water Pollution and what can be done about it. He urged everyone who is interested to attend the meeting.

Help for the Newsbuoy staff was discussed again, and Mrs. Russell volunteered to help with the typing.

Mr. Steele brought up the problem of outsiders coming

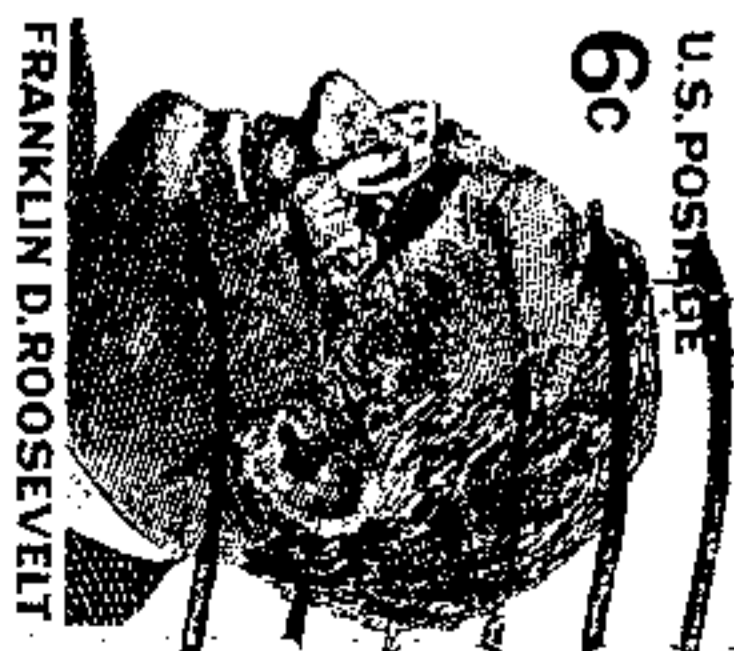
