

CIVIC ASSOCIATION MINUTES

May 19, 1969

The meeting of the Civic Association of Arden on the Severn was called to order at 8:10 p.m. The minutes of the previous meeting were read and corrected to show that the movie noted to be shown by the Ladies of Arden was in May. The Treasurer's report was approved as presented.

Mr. Trask reported for the Sports Committee that the Little League boys and fathers are working every Saturday afternoon. They need more boys if we are going to field a team by next year -- The age limits are between 7 and 16. The equipment has been ordered. At 6 o'clock on Saturday, the 24th, they are going to have a men's softball game as well. The group is making a temporary backstop and Mr. Jimmy Goode is going to drag the infield for the team.

Mr. Sudwarth reported the clearing and filling of the ground has been done and paid for. The area should be used for parking to pack the ground down except in case of rain. The rain spouts on the building have been fixed, thanks to Mr. Meredith, who also noticed that the outside light fixtures need some work and probably should be replaced with weatherproof material.

Mr. Sudwarth reported for the Nominating Committee the following slate of candidates: for President - Mr. Wilber and Mr. Steele; for Vice-President - Mr. Dick Russell and Mr. Gordon Swanson; for Treasurer - Mrs. Shirley Wilber and Mrs. Maurine Crum; for Recording Secretary - Mrs. Sudwarth; and for Corresponding Secretary - Mrs. Fran Couch; for Building Trustees - Mrs. Darne, Mrs. Wilber and Mr. Ed Dean. Additional nominations for all of these offices may be made at the June meeting at the time of the election.

Mrs. Wilber: For the Membership Committee - Packets of membership cards and maps showing areas to be covered have been prepared and are available for distribution.

Mr. Ewell reported he will have a report on the diving platform at the next meeting.

Mrs. Sparhawk, reported for the Ladies of Arden, the June meeting will feature a speaker from the Coast Guard.

Mr. Steele asked whether names of the Section Delegates appear in the paper and indicated he thought they should.

Mr. Steele would like to have some help on Saturday, the 24th to burn the wrecked boat at the boat dock at Sec. 4. Mr. Charles Boyer, Acting Chief of the Herald Harbor Fire Department will be requested to have a truck standing by during the burning. Volunteers included Messrs. Clark, Baham, Ewell, Russell and Schreffler. The Association was to provide the kerosene required, and offers of dona-

tions were also made by Mr. Ewell and Mr. Walz.

Mrs. Maiatico reported for Mr. Coale there have been numerous problems with the chain at the Boat dock area for Section 1, and a section is now missing. It seems the only solution is for the two families (Maiatico and Coale) to fence their property, which extends out into the docking area.

Mr. Steele announced that anyone who has problems should get through to Mr. Atas at one of the following numbers: 569-9400 or 569-9107. His Glen Burnie office number is 761-7123.

After considerable discussion on the beach problem, Mr. Steele suggested a letter be drawn up to Mr. Atas demanding that he solve our problems. He also suggested that each family in residence contribute \$10 for the betterment of the Community.

Mr. Steele made a motion: That we write a letter under the auspices of the meeting telling them the demands of the Community and that a letter be written tonight to be signed by everyone in the building; also contrary to most beliefs, Beach Shores is no longer in business and that the Civic Association empower an attorney to find out the Board of Directors and stock holders who own the boat ramps and beaches and to add to this motion that the funds for this activity be provided from the building fund and that we investigate the possibility of collection on a personal basis from each family in all five sections to raise money to be spent according to the Association wishes.

After discussion, Mr. Russell seconded the motion and the vote was 1 yes, 32 noes.

Mrs. Sparhawk made a motion that a letter of request to Mr. Atas be formulated by a special committee (the Beaches and Current Needs Committee) to be presented at the next meeting and perhaps taken home to be signed by neighboring residents. This motion was seconded and passed unanimously.

A second motion was made that through donated funds by interested citizens of the Community to hire an attorney or by other means to find out exactly who are the Board of Directors of Sunrise Beach, Inc. Then if no action is taken we contact by written formal letter the Board of Directors with our requests.

Mr. Steele then asked that the motion be tabled until the June meeting.

A motion to adjourn was heard and seconded at 10:45 p. m.

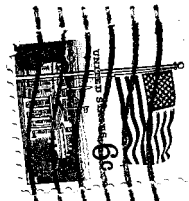
