CIVIC ASSOCIATION MINUTES

June 16, 1969

The meeting of the Civic Association was called to order at 8:10 PM, with 73 members and guests in attendance. The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved, as was the Treasurer's report.

Mr. Trask reported for the Committee on Sports that Mr. Steele has talked with Del. Anderson and Sen. Bertier again with regard to securing permission to use a portion of the state hospital farm as a ball field, and is going to get in touch with Sen. Bertier again to work out details for permanent use. Mr. Dean obtained the pipe, Mr. Steele obtained the fence from National Fence Company and the pipe threaders from Arundel Gas. Mr. Steele is to cut the grass and Mr. Goode is to grade the field. The men's softball has been successful. It was noted that we owe a lot of thanks to Mr. Steele for his efforts and he was given a round of applause.

Mr. Sudwarth reported for the Beaches and Current Needs Committee. A meeting had been held to draft a letter to Mr. Atas as proposed at the last meeting. This letter was presented to the membership and was signed by most of the members present and the Corresponding Secretary was directed to get the letter and signatures in the mail the following day. A light is to be installed at Beach 1 after 1 July, and we need the written permission of property owners in Section 5 to have a light installed on private property.

Mr. Steele asked that thanks be given to those who helped on the boat burning project.

Mr. Stanley announced that Officer Severance of the County Police has been assigned to this area on a permanent basis.

Mrs. Couch reported that police had been called because of a party that Arden teens had held on Beach 1. It was agreed that when local residents have obtained permission to hold a beach party, that it should be advertised on the bulletin boards to avoid such a happening in the future.

Mrs. Sparhawk announced that the Ladies of Arden are going to have a private beach party from 9:00 to 1:00 AM on July 26. The LOA meeting on 7 July will feature a Yoga instructor. The entrance will be dedicated after the letter-

ing and the landscaping have been completed.

Old Business: Mr. Steele brought up his motion which had been tabled at the last meeting and requested that it be held over until the July meeting. The motion was reread and Mr. Steele announced that the Board of Directors of Sunrise Beach, Inc., consist of Mr. and Mrs. Atas.

New Business: The President announced the election of officers and called for a reading of nominees as presented by the nominating committee.

The nominees for President, Mr. Wilbur and Mr. Steele both declined to run and presented Mr. Dick Russell as their candidate. Mrs. Wilbur nominated Mr. Howard Stanley. Mr. Stanley was elected.

Mr. Wilbur was nominated as an additional candidate for Vice President. Mr. Russell was elected.

Additional nominations for Secretary included Mrs. Jackie Trask and Mrs. Francine Stoops. Mrs. Stoops declined the nomination. Mrs. Trask was elected.

Mr. Trask was nominated as an additional candidate for Treasurer and was elected.

Mrs. Couch declined the nomination as Corresponding Secretary. Additional nominations included Mrs. Stoops and Miss Irene DuBois. Mrs. Stoops was elected.

Mrs. Wilbur and Mr. Dean were selected as the new members of the Board of Trustees for the Building.

A motion to adjourn this part of the meeting was heard and carried at 9:55, and the floor was yielded to the newly elected officers.

MINUTES FOR THE NEW ADMINISTRATION

After the election, the new administration took over the meeting. Mr. Stanley thanked everyone for their support and assured them that he would do the best job he could.

The floor then divided up into sections to elect their prospective delegates. The following delegates were announced:

- Section 1 — Mr. Ronald Coale
- Section 2 — Mrs. Fran Couch
- Section 3 — Mrs. Gertrude Stroessner
- Section 4 — Mr. William Sudwarth
- Section 5 — Mr. Gordon Swanson

Mr. Dwight Steele brought up the question of whether we should mail the letter to Mr. Atas immediately or wait until we get additional signatures. After much discussion, it was decided that we would send it the following morning. Mrs. Sudwarth said that she thought we should change the signature from "The Citizens of Arden" to "The Civic Association". This was discussed and it was decided to leave the signature as it was. Mr. William Sudwarth made a motion to mail the letter the following morning as it was. The motion was seconded by Mr. Dwight Steele and was passed.

Mr. Stanley explained that the Executive Committee consisted of the Board and delegates from each section. He then read the list of committees and said he would try to appoint committee heads by the July meeting. It was also announced that the immediate past president would also be a member of the Executive Committee.

Mr. Lawrence Armitage suggested that we begin a Fishing, Hunting, and Shooting Club. Anyone interested in this should contact him at 920 2742.

Mr. Joel Sparhawk said he thought the Baseball Committee should be incorporated into the Recreation Committee. Everyone thought this was a good idea.

Mr. Stanley announced that there would be a meeting for anyone interested in helping with the Arden Day Picnic on Monday, June 23rd at 8:PM. Mr. Pete Cranford has volunteered to chair the committee. Mr. Archie Davis made a motion that the committee be allotted \$400.00 to start the proceedings for the picnic. It was seconded by Mr. Dwight Steele and was passed. The picnic will be held on Saturday, August 16th, 1969.

Mr. Stanley asked Mr. Sudwarth if he would continue to be the advisor for lights and County items.

FROM THE PRESIDENT'S
CORNER



As the newly elected President of the Arden Civic Association, I would like to take this opportunity to introduce myself and to thank all those Ardenites who took the time to come out and vote at the last Association meeting. I was very gratified at the sizeable turnout at the June meeting and I sincerely hope that we will continue to draw as many and more members throughout the coming year.

I feel that the ability of any community to help itself lies in the strength of people who "join". There are problems in Arden which can be overcome only if the people here really want to help; and the way to help is to join together in the Association. We need you now and if you have been somehow overlooked by your section representative please contact him or me for membership information.

There are several ambitious programs underway which need everyone's support. A recreation program is well underway to provide sports activities for young and almost young alike. The thing it needs is people — if your kids and teenagers want to play ball send them to the recreation area just off Omar Drive at Whitney Landing Drive any Saturday afternoon — if you older guys like softball you can stretch your muscles there from 6PM on every Saturday.

I would also like to put in a pitch about the annual Arden picnic. This is the "big" shindig put on by the Association and the primary fund raiser for the year. The tickets are cheap and the beer and games are all good — take advantage of August 16! Get out to meet your neighbors and help your community out!

As some of you are aware we have some problems in Arden. Not the least of them is petty vandalism and rowdiness which disrupts and disturbs the harmony Arden should enjoy. These activities are not and should not be "a way of life" for us. I don't pretend to know the solution and I certainly don't advocate a "police state" type of control over our young citizens. I would like very much to get some ideas from the young people of Arden about what you would like to do to make life more interesting. My administration and I are open to ideas — some of us may be over 30 but we feel you have a place in the community and a voice in planning some of your own activities.

Another problem lies in beach and boat area control. If you are not aware of the fact, the Civic Association does not

own or control these facilities. They are owned and operated by a Corporation not affiliated with the Association. Improvement options are exercised by Charles Atas, President of the Corporation; however, the Association seats a committee of section representatives to assess Arden needs and to present them to Mr. Atas for his consideration. Many needed improvements have been made and Mr. Atas is ambitious in providing safe and clean swimming and boating areas. We cannot rely entirely upon him to serve all our needs, however. In the course of the next year I hope to develop some firm programs where in the Association along with Mr. Atas can provide needed recreational and social improvements. As a parting shot I would like to reiterate that civic improvements are never free — we need your help, so please join the Civic Association!! See you at the next meeting, JULY 21.

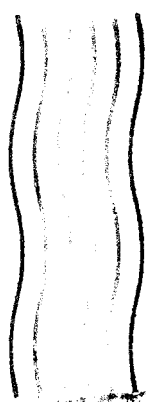


