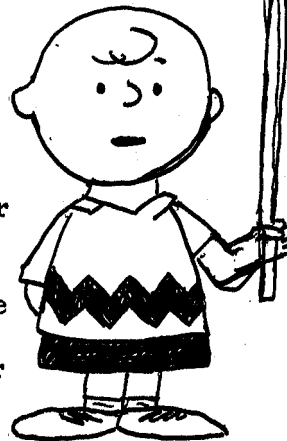
FIRE DEP'T FUND DRIVE

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE JULY ACA MEETING

(Note that the following article merely gives some highlights of the meeting. To hear a reading of the official minutes, attend the August meeting.)

Twenty seven members and three guests attended the meeting. Mr. Stanley, the President, said that he was in the process of selecting chairmen for the committees; and that one member of each committee would be a representative from the Executive Committee. He announced that Mr. Sudwarth is the Chairman of the Roads, Grounds and Lights Committee, and Mr. Strootman is Chairman of the Newsbuoy Staff. Chairmen for the following Committees are still to be confirmed: Beaches, Boats and Docks; Fire and Police protection; Public Relations; Social Events and Recreation; and the Sick Committee. Volunteers for Chairmen and Committee members are asked to call Mr. Stanley.

The Executive Committee will meet on the first Thursday of each month. At this meeting the agenda for the next ACA meeting will be prepared. To include anything on the agenda, members are urged to call Mr. Stanley before the Executive Committee meeting. Mr. Stanley proposed that the Association have more social events. He announced that contrary to past custom there would be an Association meeting in August. He then urged all members to sell as many 50/50 tickets as possible. Also, in order to assist Mr. Russell take an inventory of everything owned by the ACA, everyone keeping or knowing about such property is asked to call Mr. Russell.

Mr. Sudwarth of the Roads, Grounds and Lights Committee reported that he was making arrangements to have the ACA building repaired. The members present voted to appropriate not more than \$100.00 for the job.

A motion was passed authorizing the Treasurer to invest the Association funds with the institution he considers best. Finally, there was discussion of printing a booklet giving useful information about Arden; but no decision was reached.

JEANNE FINK'S CINNAMON PEACH COFFEE CAKE

INGREDIENTS

Batter: 3 eggs, 1 1/2 cups sugar, 2 cups flour, 2 tsp. baking powder, 3/4 cup milk, 4 tbs. melted margarine. Topping: 5 tbs. melted margarine, 1 can peaches or fresh peaches, 1/4 cup sugar, 1 tsp. cinnamon.

DIRECTIONS

Beat eggs until light and foamy. Slowly add 1 1/2 cup sugar. Sift dry ingredients together. Add dry ingredients -- alternating with the milk -- to egg mixture. Add to batter 4 tbs. melted margarine. Spread 5 tbs. melted marg. on raw batter. Arrange drained peaches on batter. Sprinkle with cinnamon sugar mixture. Bake in 400 deg. oven 25 to 30 min. Use two 9 inch pans, or a 13 X 9 X 2 inch pan. Grease pans. Thanks for sharing your recipe with us Jeanne!


