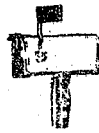

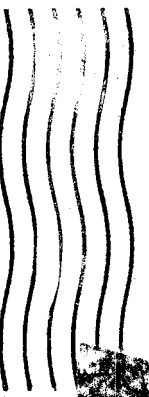
We're sorry that no pictures from the picnic are available for the paper at this time. If possible, we hope to get some prints in time for the October issue.

Rusty Smith is going on R & R to Thailand. Hope he has a good time and gets a good rest.

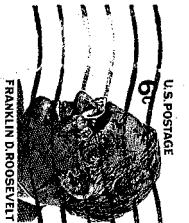
The Walker girls from Altoona, Pa., (Marge Eldridge's sisters) came in for a week, and it looks as though Marie may be able to stay for a while.


