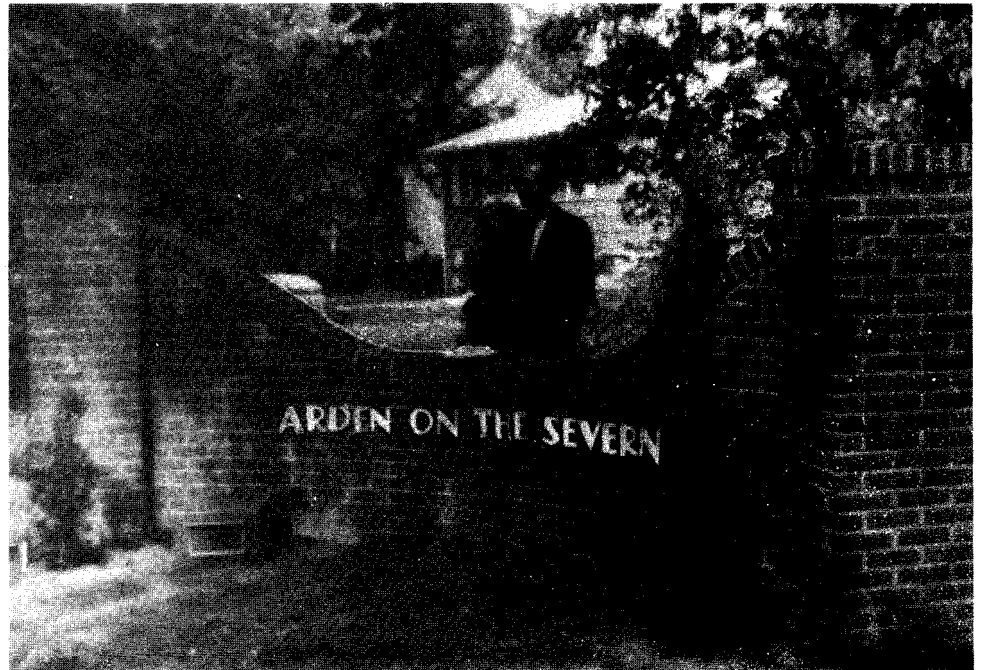

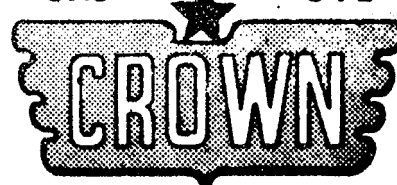

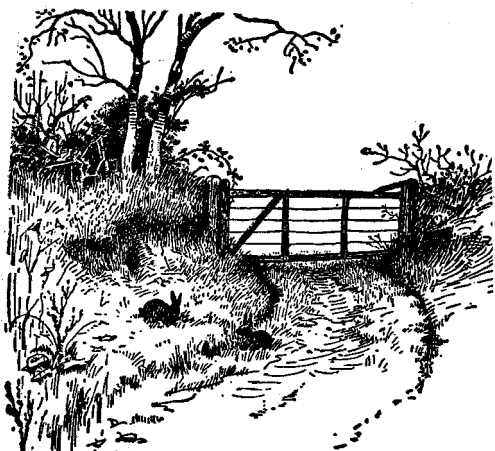

CORNER



Something happened in Arden last month that we can and should all take pride in. After a long and tedious time the Ladies of Arden saw the completion of their "entrance wall". Walls are various things to many people - to some they keep people in and to others they keep people out. To the ancient Chinese for instance, their Great Wall protected their civilization and sheltered them - or so they thought - from barbarious hordes without. The Berlin Wall on the other hand, is in fact a prison wall which keeps people in. Ours, of course, is neither of these. It represents, at least to me, that there need be no walls at all. The act of erecting a wall which has no practical value is in reality an invitation which says "You are welcome here, you may come and go as you wish". It's abbreviated form is symbolic of the freedoms we enjoy, for it neither hinders nor prevents social traffic.

More close to home, this wall also represents the steadfastness of a group of Arden citizens who originated and clung to an idea - a plan to make Arden a more beautiful and enjoyable place to live.

That this wall will suffer more at the hands of vandals I have no doubt. Even so, we cannot deny ourselves the privilege and duty of building Arden into a place of beauty just because of a few misguided individuals. I hope all Ardenites can look at "our wall" with a sense of pride and with a renewed sense of dedication to bring the rest of Arden up to the standards represented by that spot. If one small group of us can pursue an idea and see it finished there is little reason that the entire community can't pursue similar ideas to make Arden a really model community. You have heard it before and I will say again - you can't afford to sit back and let your community stagnate or be dictated to - there are many jobs to be done here in Arden and the only people qualified to direct Arden are Ardenites. The Civic Association is only the direction post, its officers cannot do the jobs required without your backing, support and involvement. You must care about Arden - if you don't no one else will!

Beaches are already becoming eye sores. Have you visited any of them lately? The Life Guard Building on beach 4 has been damaged considerably, the picnic tables have been damaged and ruts exist from spinning car wheels. Beach 2 has a damaged bench, damaged Life Guard building, and a discarded sofa and chair. Beach 1 continues to have litter strewn about. Beach 5 needs the door on Life Guard Building fixed and trash is strewn about.

These beaches, docks and ramps are not the property of Arden and for this reason there is no money for maintenance. All maintenance is done at the discretion of the Owner (Sunrise Beach, Inc.) The greater demand for maintenance through lack of concern on the part of Ardenites, may well bring about more maintenance than the Owner of these properties may want to furnish, consequently further deterioration of our beaches, docks and ramps will result.

In order to receive as much assistance from the Owner, it behooves us to take a sincere interest in our community and carry out as much maintenance in these areas as we possibly can.

It would be nice if we could have:

- a. Clean beaches, docks and ramps.
- b. Additional sea nettle nets.
- c. Early installation of the nets.
- d. Less damage to Sunrise Beach properties.

e. Lots more fun next summer.

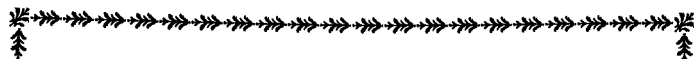
